Manuscript submissions

AVAR is dedicated to publishing open-access peer-reviewed scholarship on Anatolia, Egypt, the Levant, and Mesopotamia in the second and first millennia BCE that crosses and disrupts disciplinary boundaries. All contributors must submit to AVAR via the online submission process after registering with the journal's website.

Works submitted for publication are entered into a double-blind peer review system and normally read by at least two assessors. The Editors' decision will be final. Articles submitted to AVAR should be original pieces of work, not published before and, not under consideration for publication elsewhere in either printed or electronic form.

Please make sure your manuscript is prepared according to the guidelines provided on the AVAR website.

Editorial Policy

All submitted papers are screened and reviewed by the editorial and/or external reviewers. Referees are expected to provide supportive comments regarding their decisions. Following the receipt of a manuscript in the appropriate format, we anticipate a decision within three months.
